

**Table 1. Summary of apiary and beekeeper registration requirements across Canada
– draft 1 (2 Jan. 2019)**

E.g.	Province	Details
1	B.C.	Beekeeping regulated under the <i>Animal Health Act</i> . ⁱ Registration with chief veterinarian of the province. Bee colonies, locations, etc. must be registered. No fee.
2	Alberta	Beekeeping regulated by the <i>Bee Act</i> . ⁱⁱ Beekeepers must register with the Provincial Apiculturist in accordance with the regulations. No fee.
3	Saskatchewan	Beekeeping regulated by the <i>Apiaries Act</i> , 2005. Beekeeping certificate required from the Province. ⁱⁱⁱ No fee.
4	Manitoba	Beekeeping regulated by <i>The Bee Act</i> . Beekeepers must be registered under the Act. ^{iv} No fee.
5	Ontario	Beekeeping regulated by the <i>Bees Act</i> . Beekeepers must be registered with the Provincial Apiarist. ^v No fee.
6	Quebec	Beekeeping regulated by the <i>Animal Health Protection Act</i> . Beekeeper registration is required. ^{vi} Annual registration fee of \$17.97.
7	New Brunswick	Beekeeping regulated by the <i>Apiary Inspection Act</i> . Beekeepers and apiaries must be registered. ^{vii} No fee.
8	Nova Scotia	Beekeeping regulated by the <i>Bee Industry Act</i> . Beekeepers must register with the provincial apiarist. ^{viii} No fee.
9	Prince Edward Island	Beekeeping regulated under the <i>Animal Health and Protection Act</i> , Chapter A-11.1, “Bee Health Regulations” but the focus is on protecting genetics and health of provincial bees. Bee Health Certificate required. ^{ix} No fee.
10	Newfoundland & Labrador	<i>Animal Health and Protection Act</i> provides regulatory framework regarding honey bee health. ^x There is no mention of apiary registration in the Act. However, the provincial apiarist invites beekeepers to register on a voluntary basis.
